

# ISOCTAL Poster Guidelines

As you know, a good poster should be a *minimum* of clutter and of dense text but a *maximum* of relevant, informative statements as well as attractive, comprehensible graphics. A well-prepared poster will help to convey your work in enough detail and inspire comments.

ISOCTAL welcomes posters which take the following points into consideration:

1. Size of the poster: A1 594X841
2. Essential components of the poster:
  - a title of the research;
  - rationale;
  - description of your research, including participant information if applicable;
  - a presentation of the results (in graphs, charts or figures) with highlights of crucial results or examples supporting argumentation (if theoretical);
  - some conclusions;
  - key references
3. Headings for different sessions: Yes.
4. Font of the text: size 16-36; use a preferred style but avoid fonts that are difficult to read.
5. Lamination of the poster: No.
6. Prepare handouts of the poster as well for conference audiences.
